

Pastor's Pen

The war in Israel between Israel and Hamas, and the tragic human suffering we are seeing on our televisions and reading about in our newspapers, is just weeks old. Yet, it has captured our attention. The war in Ukraine is well into its second year in most of our news cycles. We have forgotten that for the Ukrainians, this war began in 2014 with the Russian occupation of Crimea. It is almost beyond description the pain and grief many are experiencing in relationship to both events. A BBC news report to which I listened reported on a Palestinian journalist who gave birth to a daughter during the bombardment one night early in the war. As I write this, I am recalling the children which appear to have been spirited into Russia from Crimea as part of the occupation of that war.

This past week over 100 prestigious medical journals, including the *Journal of the American Medical Association*, JAMA, and the *British Medical Journal*, published the same editorial. The editorial, from October 25, was entitled, "Time to Treat the Climate and Nature Crisis as One Indivisible Global Health Emergency." In the editorial, the medical community was called to urgently see the climate and nature crisis as a global public health crisis. The authors, in part, argued that the loss of biodiversity and green space, along with climate change, present a great risk to human health at a planetary scale. The growing crisis around the world for fresh, clean water is one example. It is hard to read the editorial and not feel a sense of urgency.

War, climate crisis, and crisis in our natural world are not signs of God's reign. They aren't indicators of hope. Our spiritual lives are not lived in a vacuum. We can't help but turn to God in prayer when we pray with these types of concerns on our heart and mind along with concerns for friends and family, and the circumstances we encounter in our day-to-day living. I bring with me stories I've heard in a podcast, read in a newspaper, and seen in a news video. I bring with me the compassion which perhaps led me to shed a tear because a little girl will know nothing but war from the day she was born. I bring with me the frustration that more isn't being done to be faithful stewards of our natural world. When I come before God, I come with all the same parts of myself with which I live each day – even the parts of myself I don't like. I come with the joys, frustrations, pains, anxieties, hopes, dreams, and prejudices.

I look at the great problems of the world, and I ask, "Where is God in this?" Every time I want to blame God, I walk to the mirror in the bathroom and ask the same question looking at myself. Prayer has taught me that God sees me for who I am; nothing is hidden from God. No matter how many times I tell God how unlovable I am, or unworthy I am, or anything thing else which says, "I'm not enough for God," God crashes my pity party. God isn't asking me to end wars, fix global warming, end the crisis in our natural world, or establish world peace. God is simply loving me and is going to love me regardless of what I want or don't want. This is how God is renewing us by loving us so that we might love in return.

We face many issues at many different scales – globally, nationally, regionally, and locally. We face our own issues in our homes and private lives, some which may be known only to us and God, to us and a few others, or only to God. God loves all of it and redeems all of it. That's the Good News: God redeems. The extremely ugly like war, the ravages of the climate crisis, and the destruction of our natural world, are redeemed by God, too. We may not see it or understand it, but God redeems all of us, not just the parts of our individual lives we want to share with God. God redeems the entire human condition, too, including the parts we mess up. There is plenty of ugly in this world. The Good News is there is more than enough redemption for all of it, with ample left over, in the work Jesus did on the Cross.

Celebrate Wonder

Celebrate Wonder All Ages is a curriculum that honors the spiritual life of children. Celebrate Wonder All Ages will engage children in open-ended exploration and inquiry of the Bible. Through experiential activities, spiritual practices, and reflection, Celebrate Wonder All Ages serves as a biblical guide to help children make meaning for their lives. This curriculum seeks to deepen children's faith formation and to create a safe space for children to ask big questions and claim their spiritual identity as children of God.

Unit 3: Faith To Believe in God's presence and to hope.

November 5, Birthright Genesis 25:29-34

Although Jacob and Esau were twins, they were very different. They looked different, and they liked different things. Esau liked the outdoors and being with wild animals. Jacob preferred to be around tame animals and enjoyed cooking. Jacob was Rebecca's favorite son, possibly, because she believed him to be chosen by God.

This month we will be exploring how God blesses each of us. Praying is one way we can connect with God and ask for blessings in our lives.

November 12, The Blessing - Genesis 27:1-45

Blessing: All the things God provides.

Jacob now has his brother's birthright, but to receive the inheritance he must also receive the full blessing from his father Isaac. If Isaac gave the blessing to Jacob, Jacob would inherit everything. We often think Rebecca and Jacob were being sneaky, and they were. Maybe, however, they knew something the rest of us didn't. When Rebecca was pregnant with the twins, "the boys pushed against each other inside her" (Genesis 25:22).

November 19, Jacob's Ladder Genesis 28:10-22

Jacob finally got the birthright and the blessing that rightfully belonged to Esau. However, because of Esau's anger, Jacob had to flee his home and family. As Jacob was leaving his home and traveling to Harangue, he grew tired. He found a stone, placed it near his head, lay down to sleep, and had a very vivid dream. He dreamed that there was a large staircase that started on the ground and reached into the sky. God appeared in Jacobs dream and promised to be with Jacob, and to bless him and all of his descendants— promises that God had made to Abraham and Isaac.

Genesis 28:15 I am with you now, I will protect you everywhere you go.

God sometimes shows up in our lives, in very unexpected ways. We might not have a vivid dream of angels and staircases. However, there might be times when we least expect it, that God leads us and shows us a new way. This can happen through prayer meditation, a walk outside, or even through a conversation. There are no limits to where God might show up. If we will pay attention, we can find God everywhere.

November 26, A Peaceable Kingdom Isaiah 11:6-9

Today we will hear from the prophet Isaiah. 700 years before Jesus was born, the prophet, Isaiah, foretold of a time of unprecedented peace. Isaiah described a world where animals that are usually enemies would live peacefully together, where there was no violence or pain, and where children could live in safety and free from fear. There is hope in these verses— hope that God's peaceable kingdom will one day arrive.

Isaiah's description of peaceful times ahead, brought hope to a weary world and people living in difficult times. We still long today for the peace Isaiah spoke of. We are still looking for hope. But each of us can participate in this dream—even children. We can join in God's vision by being dreamers. When we read the scripture, we can begin to wonder what kind of world God desires. We answer this call by offering compassion, kindness, and goodness to our hurting world. Imagine God's Kingdom being here on earth, and everyone being a part of it. What a blessing.

Isaiah's prophecy May be new to many children. Help your children connect Isaiah's description of peace to the message of peace. Jesus taught throughout his life. This time of year is exciting for children. With Christmas around the corner, they may have more trouble than usual sitting still. Balance play time with quiet time. Remind them that it is important to have quiet time with God as well.




